10.1 <u>Board Policy Update</u>

10.1.1 AR5148 Childcare and Development (BP/AR Revised)

Regulation updated to reflect NEW LAW (SB 792, 2015) which requires employees and volunteers at a child care center to be immunized against influenza, pertussis, and measles, with specified exemptions. Regulation revised to reflect NEW LAW (SB 277, 2015) which eliminates the personal beliefs exemption for immunization of enrolled children unless a letter or affidavit was submitted by January 1, 2016, in which case the exemption will only be effective until the child reaches the next grade span. Regulation also reflects NEW LAW (AB 982, 2015) which authorizes the district liaison for homeless students, a Head Start program, or a transitional shelter to identify a child in need of subsidized child care services.

10.1.2 BP5145.11 Questioning and Apprehension By Law Enforcement

The district recently received correspondence from the ACLU titled "Report and Policy Recommendations on Police in Schools". Among the policy recommendations cited in the report was a call for districts to first secure consent from the principal and the student's parents or guardians. Our current policy has limited parental notification language after the interview occurs but no parental consent prior to an interview. The recommendations from the ACLU and the current district policy are included in the meeting materials.

Preschool Report

Mr. Freeman shared with the board Preschool staffing has been challenging due to trying to find subs and replacements for staff who are on medical leave or have resigned. The preschool staff have been wonderful and flexible doing whatever they can to make things happen.

Chief Business Official's Report

Mrs. Brown reported she attended a CBO boot camp that was really great. It was a long couple of days but she learned so much. She shared with the board revenue and expenditure history and projections based on the adopted budget and salaries and benefits as a percentage of revenues and expenditures. She noticed when salaries and benefits are above 80% of revenue, the trend has been the district will deficit spend.

Mr. Freeman reported four safety straps were installed on basketball hoops in the gym, with the intention of installing other four next year. MUR bleachers are being finished up, and he plans on doing a facility walkthrough with Keith and Mrs. Pellizzari to build winter break facility list. The Kindergarten playground structure is set to be installed beginning December 5th.

11.7.5 Staff Development Report

Mr. Freeman wanted to thank the staff who attended the Trauma Informed Practices training with Kelly Rizzi. Thank you to Catherine Thompson for training the aides, and there have been conversations in leadership about using minimum days for some vertical articulation. At the January staff development day, our Google Certified Educators will be helping staff use the tools in the classrooms and Mrs. E. Davis is attending a multi-sensory reading intervention in Fresno.
